The Karl Lueger monument

- Location: 1st district Dr.-Karl-Lueger-Platz, Vienna
- Design: Josef Müllner (sculptor and professor at the Academy of Vienna)
- He started sculpturing the statue in 1913 and was interrupted by WWI
- The memorial was uncovered on the 19th of September 1926
- **Requested:** by the conservative party of Austria / 2 Weeks after Lueger's Death
- Costs/donations: 27 000 Kronen were collected in one year





Dr. Karl Lueger

- *24th of October 1844 / + 10th of March
 1910
- Occupation: Lawyer, Politician, Mayor
- Career: studied law sciences →
 opened his own chancellery in 1874 →
 united anti-semites and democrats in
 1886 to gain more loyal voters
- Mayor of Vienna: 1897-1910



Monument (Denkmal)

- No clear definition
- the aesthetic of the memorial defines its character and purpose;
 oftentimes praising
- No reason for existence given





Memorial (Mahnmal)

- Sub-category => critically reflects on historical events and individuals
- Can be artistically constructed
- From the form one can conclude what it reminds

of



Why is the **Lueger monument** not a memorial?

- Standing on a resting place, tall, looking down
- No specification of what he has done / who he is

Iconoclasm and other movements

• **Iconoclasm** is the importance of the destruction of certain sacred monuments, buildings or images, usually for political or religious reasons

• **Example:** When monuments of racist figures were destroyed during the Black Lives Matter protests

• Another solution: reconstructing the monument or adding an explanation and hence making it a memorial
